TIMETABLES & FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL SCHEDULE

Students and families will be notified of the publication of schedules to the Aspen portals through School Messenger and Newswire. Parents/Guardians - Please ensure you have registered for the Aspen Family/Parent Portal and notify the school of any changes to your personal email address or primary phone number during the summer.

Procedures for course changes will be communicated to students in September. Emergency course changes will be prioritized the first week of school.





Student Success at SMH



The Student Success Department at St. Mary's is designed to help students get to where they need to go.
