


From the Deacon's Bench...



Course Selection

Students have now entered their course selections for next year. They were directed to check requirements for both their 'diploma, and 'Red Seal' if they are in High Skills Major, in addition to their post-secondary requirements. myBlueprint has links to this information and research.

Please note:

Students will receive confirmation of course selections for next year with their semester 2 midterm report card. Students who wish to make changes to their course selections need to request a guidance appointment through the school website by the middle of May.

After that time, there will be limited course changes until the second week of September.

Summer School

Students who wish to take summer school can sign up directly at https://stlouis.wcdsb.ca/summer-programs/summer-credit/. Students will need their OEN and their guidance counsellor's email address. Additional summer school offerings have been communicated through the guidance google classroom. Students who wish to take a summer school course from another school board need to register through their guidance counsellor. Please make an appointment.

Community Service Hours

To be eligible to participate in convocation, it is **mandatory** that each student does the following:

Has successfully **completed the Grade 10 Literacy Test** (OSSLT) or the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course

Has completed and documented **20 hours of community service** (due in Guidance by April 30th, 2022)

Is a member of the 2022 grade 12 cohort – you do not need to have completed your 30 credits by June to participate in the ceremony BUT *Completion of 30 credits is still required to receive your high school diploma*.

Tickets and Rehearsal

Tickets for entry into the Centre in the Square (4 tickets per student participant, participant does not require a ticket) and details concerning the night of convocation such as start time, dress code, rehearsal details, etc. will be distributed in May/June after the fee payment deadline. All guests, including children and babies in laps, need a ticket to get in. Special Seating must be reserved ahead of time through the school at time of Fee payment. Students are expected to arrive at Centre in the Square by 5:15pm for check in, instructions and rehearsal. Arriving after this time may forfeit your seat on stage!

Awards

Convocation Ceremony Eligibility

All students who are part of the Grade 12 Class Cohort are eligible to participate in the convocation ceremony this year even if they haven't earned all 30 credits. **Students still need to complete 30 credits to earn their high school diploma,** but even if a student comes back for a 5th year to finish their diploma, this year's ceremony is the only ceremony they can attend.

Turtoring Program at St. Mary's

The Ministry of Education has recently announced a grant for schools to provide FREE school tutoring for students.

This is welcomed news and may provide some additional support for students who have had their learning interrupted as a result of the pandemic.

Students are welcome to attend these "drop in" tutoring sessions that will be offered Monday through Thursday every week. The sessions will last one hour in duration and will be offered 4 times per week. Various teachers will be available to support students working on assignments, homework and/or test preparation in their courses. We are hopeful that this will be a great opportunity for St. Mary's students to improve their level of achievement in their courses, complete outstanding work or receive extra help with challenging concepts. The sessions will run until June 20^{th} .




Ontario Poet Laureate Visits St. Mary's

On Tuesday March 29th, Randell Adeji, visited St. Mary's High School and led a writer's workshop for students. Adeji is the first ever Poet Laureate for the province of Ontario and is a member of the Legislature for the Province of Ontario. Part of his mandate is to promote art and literacy in Ontario as well as raise the profile of poets and poetry.

Several students from the school were invited to attend, including members of the Writing Cub, Black Matter's club and several English classes. Gathered in the library seminar room of the KPL, students had an opportunity to hear Adeji recite and perform several of his original poems. Additionally, he led multiple creative writing activities which allowed students to engage in the writing process and learn alongside Adeji.

After school, Adeji led a professional development workshop for teachers in the area of Language and Communication. His focus during this workshop was to help educators find ways to not only better engage students with creative writing, but also how to invite students to authentically use their personal



experiences as a springboard for creative writing. During the workshop he publicly thanked and acknowledged the influence that several of his own teachers had on him.

Growing up in Scarborough, Adeji's early adolescence found him in conflict with law and often suspended from school. Through the support of his teachers, Adeji literally found his voice and passion for creative writing and later graduated high school with honours as well as voted class Valedictorian. He later established, and continues to facilitate, a spoken word collective called R.I.S.E. (Reaching Intelligent Souls Everywhere).


Adeji currently has one book of published poetry titled *I Am Not My Struggles* which features a series of poems showcasing his wordsmithing along with poignant reflections on some of the challenges experienced by many members of society. Much of Adeji's work takes inspiration from his own narrative.

St. Mary's is fortunate and thankful for Adeji's visit as it was an amazing opportunity to learn alongside an inspirational and aspiring creative Canadian talent.
