Spotlight on Chromebooks

St. Mary's lends devices to students who need them for schoolpurposes. There are different device types/models depending on when the Board purchased the device. The two main types of devices we provide:



Chromebooks: a cloud-based device that uses Internet-based file storage, rather than storing data on the device itself. Chromebooks use **Google** operating system/apps.

Cloudbooks: also a cloud-based device, but using Microsoft operating system/apps.

The type and model issued to a student depends on availablity when the device is requested. Specific models/types cannot be requested.

Taking Care of Your School-Issued Chromebook

Keep your device charged & bring it to school every day. The school has a very limited supply of devices in the school Chromecarts to lend to students who forget to bring devices. Please make a habit of charging and bringing your device so you are prepared for class.

Keep your device in good condition. Keep food, drinks, or other substances that may cause damage away from your device. Don't use stickers, marker, or other items that alter the appearance of your device, as these can also damage the device.

Getting grimy? Please visit Ms. VanderHeide's office to get technology-safe alcohol wipes to clean your device.





Handle charging cords gently: Unplug charging cords by gripping and pulling the plug head, not the cord. Wrap/fold the cord loosely when not in use. Wrapping too tightly can damage the wires inside.

Chromebook slow or shutting down randomly? Check to see if your software is up to date by following instructions from the product support websites:

Chromebooks/Google

Cloudbook (Microsoft): Click the Windows icon (lower left of screen) >> Settings (gear icon) >> Update & Security

Set your keyboard to English (US). Board-installed apps work best with that language setting.

Chromebook (Google)

Cloudbook (Microsoft): Click the search box on the lower left of the screen >> search for "language settings" >> set to "English (United States)"

Damaged or malfunctioning?

Please bring it to Ms. VanderHeide in the library office to submit it for repair. Ms. VanderHeide will exchange it for another device.

Need a school-issued Chromebook but don't have one?



Chrombooks and Internet Device Return





Good day Eagles. The following is important information regarding school assigned Chromebooks and internet devices.

Graduating Grade 12 students, and students not returning to St. Mary's next year are to return their school assigned Chromebooks and charging cord to the main office between Thursday, June 16 and Monday, June 27.

Students who are returning to St. Mary's for the 2022- 2023 school year can keep their assigned Chromebook over the summer. If your school-assigned Chromebook is damaged or not working, please bring it to Ms. VanderHeide in the school library office to exchange for a replacement and to have your damaged device sent for repair as soon as possible.

Any student with an internet service device (i.e. hot spots, wifi) must return it to the main office by Monday, June 27. These devices will be disabled and will no longer be in use.
