- Register at CollegeBoard.org for SAT and ACT information.
- Check out university and college websites for programs and application instructions.
- Most use the Common App; application very detailed; requires letters of reference and essay - start ASAP!
- Watch deadlines They will vary and are earlier than Ontario.

Things to Consider

- Program requirements? Prerequisites; cut-off averages; other criteria, e.g. audition, portfolio
- Location? Home or away; size and location of city.
- Co-op or internship opportunities?
- Campus Factors? Size; atmosphere on campus; scholarships; cost of program
- Extra-curricular activities clubs, sports, etc.
- Start date some programs have start dates other than September
